Rubbish reminders

If you have large items that you want to dispose of and are unable to take them to the tip yourself, Cherwell District Council will collect them for a small charge. More information about their collections can be found here:

The cost of disposing of any fly tipped items found at Elmsbrook is unfortunately added to your service charges, so it is in everyone's interest to stop this happening.

We have also had a few incidents where there has been an infestation of maggots as the bin men have refused to take away bins which have the wrong rubbish in them. As a reminder:

Green bin – Use for non recyclable rubbish, plastic bags, wrappers **Blue bin** – Use for cartons, plastic bottles, cans, paper and cardboard **Brown bin** – (You need to have registered and paid the subscription cost of £43 a year to Cherwell District Council to receive this service) Use for grass cuttings, flowers, branches, weeds, leaves

Silver food caddy – line it with a compostable liner or newspaper. Use for tea bags, coffee grounds, food (without packaging)

Community projects and activities

We've had a really busy summer at Elmsbrook with lots of activities going on. Here's a taste of what we got up to....

Summer play day

Back for the second year running, we held our 'Summer Play Day' in Partnership with Oxfordshire Play Association on 25th July. There was a great turn out with over 300 people coming along over the course of the day.

This year's theme focused on the everyday low-cost or no-cost play adventures that children can enjoy at home, in settings, and in our communities. The event demonstrated that play opportunities don't need to involve expensive activities, costly toys, or trips to far-off destinations. It is often the simplest ideas, the free and found opportunities, which offer the most fun, and are the most developmentally beneficial for children and young people.

Elmsbrook Community Organisation ran a teddy bear tombola at the event which was very popular and all the proceeds from that went to support the Community Organisation.

















Bat walk

On Friday 8th September we held our first bat walk which was led by Veritie Turner from Bucks, Berks and Oxon Wildlife Trust. Thanks to all who came along to this really interesting event.

Veritie has a wealth of knowledge about bats so not only did we learn there are over 1,300 species of bats in the world and 18 in the UK. The one you mostly see around Elmsbrook is the common pipistrelle (the size of a 20p piece). A single pipistrelle can eat 3000 insects in a night. Once it started to get dark, we were able to detect the bats call with our special bat monitors and actually see them flying overhead.

It was a really enjoyable event and one parent feedback the following: Our boy has been talking about it lots over the weekend and so we are going to see if he would like to be involved in or have closer links to the organisation in due course.

We hope to work with Veritie and her team in the future to organise other nature and wildlife based activities.





Childrens Summer Craft activities

The OYAP Trust based in Bicester ran a series of art and drama workshops for children during August. They were a chance for children aged from 4 to 14 to be creative, try new materials and let their ideas run wild with them, work in a collaborative way and learn new skills.

The sessions were well attended and the children really enjoyed them. We are hoping to provide some Christmas craft activities for children so please keep a look out on your notice boards for more information.



Summer Pop up Forest Schools

The Pop-up Forest Schools are particularly successful and this summer was no exception. Organised in partnership with Muddy feet, a local Forest School training specialist, a series of 8 Pop Up Forest Schools were held throughout July, August and September.

Muddy feet leaders got the children crafting elder beads and pencils. They turned freshly cut willow sticks into charcoal on the fire and used these for lead in the elder pencils which were then used to draw maps and pictures. They harvested some of the seeds that were planted in the wildflower patch sown at an Easter Pop Up school so they now have even more seeds to sow for next year.

Other activities included leaf bashing, nature crafts, stream paddling, practicing fire skills by toasting apples in cinnamon sugar, whittling wood, wildflower identification and nettle cordage.

Feedback from parents whose children attended the Summer pop-up sessions included:
