# **Community Hub and Local Centre**

You'll have noticed a lot of activity at the Community Hub site lately as the contractors are busy putting the finishing touches on the building. It is hoped that it will be completed this Summer. Your Elmsbrook Community Organisation (ECO) have been involved in choosing the colours for the flooring and walls for the new Community Hub. ECO members also had a tour of the site to see how the building is coming along and the space that will be available.

Although the building will be owned by A2Dominion, the Community Hub will be leased to Cherwell District Council and the café will be leased to a new provider. Cherwell District Council has stated that their preferred option would be to lease the hub to the local community through ECO.

ECO are currently carrying out a survey to find out what Elmsbrook residents would like from the new hub and how they think it should be managed. Your opinion is really important, so if you haven't completed this yet, please do so as soon as possible by clicking <a href="here">here</a>.

A2Dominion has recently gone out to tender to find a café provider which will be a perfect fit for Elmsbrook. We are looking for a provider which is sustainably conscious and promotes healthy living with a range of handmade seasonal, locally sourced food and beverages. The aim is for the new café to be a new vibrant destination at the heart of the Elmsbrook community which will deliver themed events, celebrations and pop ups and also evolve in response to local needs. 

## **Step into Spring**

Spending quality time with nature can reduce anxiety, balance your mood and help you feel more positive. Take a moment to notice nature in your daily life. You might be surprised by what you see on your daily walk or in your garden.

Cherwell District Council's 'connect with nature' webpage provides a hub of information with a monthly seasonal theme. Spring is a time of days getting longer with the sunshine bringing growth and greenery. Birdsong reaches a peak and many flowers appear, in turn attracting insects including bees and butterflies. Find out more about things to see and do in Spring here.

From March until July, the early mornings will be full of the noisy sound of songbirds. These feathered alarm clocks sing to attract a mate and also to defend where they live. The still morning air and spring chill makes for the perfect time to attract a mate, before the day's main activity of looking for food kicks off. For a morning activity like no other, wrap up and head out with a cuppa around 30 minutes before dawn to catch the full concert as it warms up.
